Class 1 Novice, any style

Not open to cutters who have won a Novice class
7 yards length. Competitors may not use chainsaws.

1st prize £40 and the Kathy Matthew Memorial Trophy

2nd prize £30 3rd prize £20

If more than 10 entries received, additional prizes to be given

Special prizes: Best Local Cutter living within a radius of 30 miles of the event.

Always ready with encouraging words for beginners, Kathy's trophy is fittingly awarded to the first Novice.

Class 2 Intermediate, any style (*this class will be run subject to sufficient entries, otherwise entrants will be allocated to Novice or Open depending on competition record to date – please complete section on entry form*).

Open to cutters who have won a Novice class and who have not been placed in the first 3 in an Open Class. 7 yards length. Competitors may not use chainsaws.

1st prize £40 and the Thrusters' Trophy

2nd prize £30 3rd prize £20

Class 3 Open, any style

8 yards length.

1st prize £50 and the Andrew Adams Perpetual Challenge Trophy

2nd prize £40 3rd prize £30

Cash prizes to 3rd. If more than 10 entries received, additional prizes to be given

Special prize for Best Cutter 25 years of age or under.

Andrew Adams, Past President of the National Hedgelaying Society, founder of the Meynell Hedgelaying, Durham Hedgelaying and North East Hedgelaying competitions, has generously donated this silver trophy which he designed and commissioned, and which is modelled on his own gosshook.

Best re-growth from hedges laid during the previous year's competition.

The David and Pam Wood trophy will be presented for the best re-growth from last year's

competition. **(As there was no match in 2020 this trophy will not be awarded)**

The Best length laid in Northumberland style.

A trophy will be presented to the cutter laying the best length in "Northumberland style" in any class.

Best Young Farmer.

Special prize for best work by any current member of a young farmers club.

Grand Prix. £200 prize to the cutter who accumulates the most points over the three matches that weekend, to include the Durham, Scottish and North East matches

Rules

1. Classes may be cancelled or amalgamated at the discretion of the Steward.
2. The organisers reserve the right to refuse any entry at their discretion.
3. Competitors are to lay the length drawn starting from their number and working towards the next highest number. They will be told which way to lay the hedge and on which side to leave the waste. Each length cut must join its neighbour.
4. The time limit for competitors will be 5 hours; 9am to 2pm. The draw will be held at 8.45am. There will be no clearing up time & competitors working past this time may not be judged.
5. Competitors may receive assistance in specific circumstances from stewards and other competitors. However if a Steward feels that non-essential assistance is being received, after one warning the competitor will be disqualified.
6. Competitors have a duty of care to themselves and other competitors with regard to safe working practice and must comply with Health and Safety Regulations.
7. 'Deadwood' use must be kept to a minimum—excessive use may be penalised by the judge.
8. Competitors competing as a pair in the novice class will be paid prize money per pair.
9. Winners of this event's Novice class may not compete in the Novice class at this event again.
10. All trophies presented are perpetual and cannot be won outright and are held for a maximum 12 month period. The winner must take personal responsibility for the safekeeping of the trophy including insurance, guaranteeing to return it by the date specified and confirm their acceptance of these terms by signing for the trophy on the day.
11. Judging will be on a points basis and the decision of the Judge is final!
